

Why is our Club Bulletin called “Westward Ho”.

In 1961 when our Club was chartered, Rotary Clubs had a defined area or territory from which they could draw new members. Consequently, when the Rotary Club of Lismore West was chartered by the Rotary Club of Lismore, the proposed area to be ceded by the Lismore Club, was that portion of their territory *“bounded on the **west** by an imaginary line in the centre of Wilson’s Creek to Wilson’s Creek bridge, across Wilson’s Creek bridge to junction of Woodlark and Molesworth Streets, south along centre line of Molesworth Street to junction of Magellan Street with Molesworth Street, east along centre line of Magellan Street to junction with Dibbs Street, south along centre line of Dibbs Street to junction with Wyrallah Street(now road), along Wyrallah Street through Wyrallah”*. Based partly on this and the fact that our Club had “West” in its name, our first Bulletin Editor, Jack Riley, made the decision to call our Club Bulletin *“Westward Ho”*.
